PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT

As a MABRL parent, I pledge to provide positive support, care, and encouragement for each child participating in the MABRL by adhering to the following code of conduct:

- Parents will make certain that their children show respect for all players, coaches, officials and spectators.
- Parents will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player or parent, such as booing, taunting or using profane language.
- Parents will teach their child that doing one's best is more important than winning.
- Parents will respect the officials and their authority during games.
- Parents will not confront coaches or umpires at any time during games.
- Parents will refrain from coaching their child or other players during games.
- Parents will inform the coach of any disability or ailment that may affect the safety of their child
- Parents will comply with the decisions of league officials and observe all rules, policies and procedures as established by the MABRL Board of Trustees.
- Parents will abide by Toomer Field's rules and maintain a smoke & alcohol free environment.

PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

As a MABRL player I pledge that I will:

- Exhibit good sportsmanship by being a team player and supporting my teammates, win or lose.
- Show respect to all coaches, players, league officials, umpires and spectators.
- Do my best to listen and learn from my coaches to improve my skills
- Congratulate the other team after each game as a demonstration of good sportsmanship.
- Not use unfriendly or profane language, insult others or physically confront any player, coach or umpire.
- Obey the rules of the game and always work for the good of the team.
- Not abuse or mistreat any equipment, including throwing equipment on the field or in the dugout.
- Not challenge or question on-field calls by umpires and/or managers and coaches.
